MOYAMOYA DISEASE

Moyamoya disease is a rare, progressive cerebrovascular disorder caused by blocked arteries at the base of the brain.

The first symptoms of moyamoya are often strokes or recurrent transient ischemic attacks (TIAs).

Other symptoms may include: headaches, seizures, vision problems, or cognitive/sensory impairment.



Moyamoya means "puff of smoke" in Japanese and is used to describe the tangled appearance of tiny vessels compensating for the blockage.

Some individuals have a close relative also affected; in these cases researchers think the disease is the result of inherited genetic abnormalities.



Several types of surgery can restore blood flow (revascularization) to the brain, often by bypassing blocked arteries.

- Without surgery, the majority of individuals with mayamaya will experience mental decline and multiple strokes because of the progressive narrowing of arteries.
- Without treatment, moyamoya can be fatal.

Medications may be prescribed to reduce the risk of stroke.
